

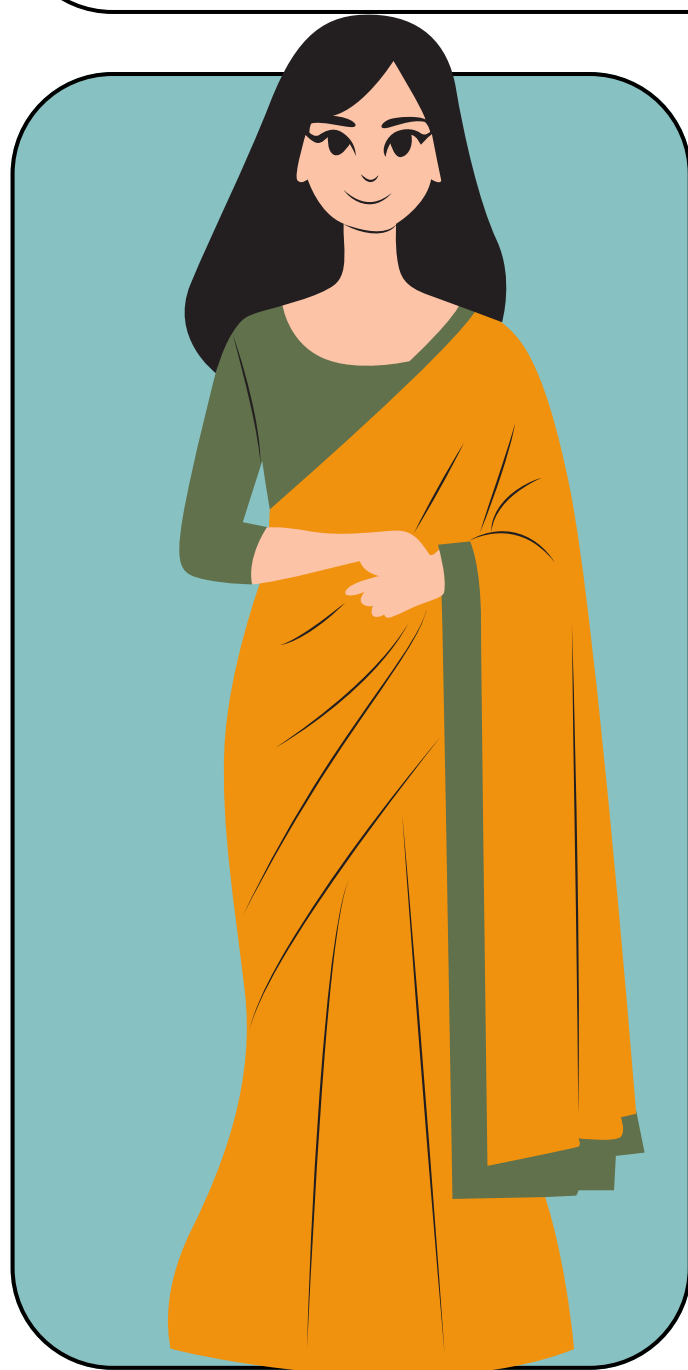
Are you an Indian-origin family caregiver for someone living with dementia (memory loss)?

4. Share your story in a safe, flexible, and respectful space.
