1763 – During Pontiac's Rebellion, Ojibwe warriors captured Fort Michilimackinac from the British. They cleverly staged a game of baggatiway (a precursor to lacrosse) near the fort, drawing the garrison's attention. When the ball was intentionally sent into the fort, the players rushed in, seizing the opportunity to launch their attack.

1953 – The coronation of Queen Elizabeth II took place at Westminster Abbey in London. The ceremony marked her official ascension to the throne following the death of her father, King George VI, in 1952.

2004 — Ken Jennings began his legendary winning streak on the iconic game show *Jeopardy!* His streak lasted for 74 consecutive games, a record that still stands, and earned him more than \$2.5 million in prize money.

As a child, Ken Jennings lived in South Korea with his family for his father's job. *Jeopardy!* was one of the few English-language shows they could watch on television.

Jane Bell (1910–1998) was a trailblazing Canadian track-and-field athlete from Toronto. In 1928, at age 18,



Bell earned her place as the youngest member of the "Matchless Six," Canada's first women's Olympic track-andfield team. They won the gold medal in world

record time in the 4x100m relay at the Amsterdam Olympic Games. Overall, the Matchless Six won four medals at the 1928 Olympic Games. Bell was also a competitive swimmer, curler, and golfer. She later became a physical education teacher in Toronto, inspiring countless young people to live healthy and active lives.
