Message From the ASNR President & CEO





This past year marked thirty years that the Alzheimer Society has been serving the Niagara Region. Our grassroots origins have had to evolve and consequently, we have become more strategic in our service delivery in order to sustain our program excellence and collaborations with other providers. As you will read, this report is a story of achievement and success. We are continually inspired by our clients, their families, and our community partners. Our organization embraced the National Charter of Rights for People with Dementia that was launched in September to address the prevailing stigma of dementia and shift public perceptions and behaviours.

We have continued to expand our educational sessions for both formal and informal caregivers by providing a variety of opportunities to increase knowledge, skills and coping capacity. We put 288 Emergency Medical Service employees through our Aging and Dementia Simulation accompanied with Finding Your Way training in October. This year, we had a total of 12,594 attendees at our various programs.

We were very fortunate to receive our own Caregiver Respite Program in November through the efforts of the Ontario Dementia Strategy. In 5 months, we provided 3,995 hours of professional PSW care to 87 clients.

Forging ahead, our voice needs to be stronger than ever as we advocate for change across all levels of government. In March, the provincial government announced legislation to manage the health system by coordinating the work of existing agencies to ensure the dollars are used more efficiently by removing overlap in infrastructure and administration. Currently, the Alzheimer Society of Niagara Region is part of a submission for a Niagara Ontario Health Team. Over the next year we could face some of our greatest challenges, as well as, some of our greatest opportunities.

Our mission could never be fulfilled without the commitment and dedication of highly skilled individuals. We would like to acknowledge the staff for their tireless devotion and compassion for the clients we serve. We would like to formally recognize the enormous contribution made by all our Board Members, volunteers, partners and donors.

There is still much to do – the demand is growing and our work is valued in the Region. With 2,056 new referrals this past year, we must remain steadfast in our obligation to ensure that individuals and families living with dementia receive the required support in order to maximize their well-being and manage the demands of caregiving.

As we continue to pursue ways to improve the impact of our services and align with the healthcare system, we are confident that we have the leadership, expertise and support to achieve our future goals for tomorrow and the next thirty years to come.






- "The 16 week caregivers course (Niagara Caregiver Network) was a phenomenal place for me to be. It has changed my life, my mind set, and helped me to find myself."



Len Thornton and his wife Linda came to Canada 38 years ago from England. Len and Linda have been married for 47 years and have three children Jon, Julia and Kristofer. They currently reside in Grimsby.

In May 2017 their lives changed when Linda was diagnosed with the onset of early dementia. The geriatrician recommended that they contact the Alzheimer Society and their journey with us began with a one to one meeting with our First Link Navigator.

Len and Linda were able to select the programs they wanted based on their needs and they have already participated in nine programs offered by the Society from Minds in Motion to the REBEL Social Group to keeping in touch with newly made friends.

Len explains that developing caregiving strategies and talking to other caregivers going through similar situations in the many education programs has been very informative. Regarding the Self-Care for the Caregiver program he states:

"This program should be an automatic choice for every Caregiver as the information and self-care awareness that this session gives is so helpful, acknowledgments of how you feel, dealing with stress, self-conditioning, being resourceful, eating healthy, keeping active, making sure that everything is in order are just a few topics that are addressed the most important aspect is Quiet Time this is for you to take time out for yourself."

Linda has stated that she found talking with other persons living with a diagnosis of dementia in her Early Stage programs to be helpful and that she has made some new friends and good bonds with our staff.

Due to Lens involvement with our organization he has agreed to volunteer to give back his time to support and lead a new Men's Support and Social Group which met for the first time in June.

Message From the ASNF Chair & CEO





The programs and services of the Alzheimer Society of Niagara Region rely on the efforts of the Foundation for approximately a half of a million dollars annually just to sustain the status quo. With the uncertainty of the healthcare system and the increasingly competitive fundraising environment, we need to continue to align with donor's philanthropic objectives and increase the Foundation's public profile.

Today's donors are not simply making a gift to an organization, they are consciously choosing to part with their own funds because something has been touched within them. They are investing in the impact that they expect their gift will bring to their community or the cause at hand. Donors want more personalized attention regarding their gifts at work. In many ways, this is a result of today's technological advancements.

Each and every gift has made a real difference in the lives of people in the Niagara Region. As we reflect back on another successful year, the Foundation raised \$482,398 in revenues through our events and donations.

We are extremely fortunate to have the endorsement and generosity of so many. Wade Stayzer, Senior VP & Chief Member Experience Officer of Meridian Credit Union spearheaded our annual Coffee Break Campaign as the Honourary Chair. The total campaign raised over \$59,000 largely due to the tremendous support of the Niagara Marine Industry Charitable Council with a donation of \$16,825.

Our Walk for Alzheimer's at Brock University raised a record amount of \$132,776 in pledges and sponsorship due to the incredible support of the community, the increased support of our local title sponsor - Avondale Food Stores, and our National Sponsor - IG Wealth Management.

The Peter Saracino Alzheimer Golf Classic, sponsored by Wormald Masse Keen Lopinski Chartered Professional Accountant and Business Advisors raised \$45,488 in net proceeds.

We have benefited from several third party events that raised \$40,643 with very little use of our internal resources. We continued to draw \$30,000 annually from the fund set up by The Robert Bell and Gladys May Bell Memorial Foundation for The Society's Incontinence and Transportation Programs.

Behind every successful organization is solid leadership, expertise and dedicated individuals. Our Board, staff, volunteers and partners continue to be the inspiration behind the Foundation's success. Without their commitment we would not be able to fulfill our financial obligations to the Alzheimer Society.


