# Message from the Board President

Dear Friends;

We are pleased to share with you a copy of the 2015-2016 Annual Report for the Alzheimer Society Peel (ASP).

As you might know, it is customary to take a moment to reflect on the work that has taken place over the last year and ensure that we are collectively fulfilling the promise we make to those dealing with the personal and social consequences of Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia.

Since 2013 we have been in compliance of the CARF International Accreditation Standards. This year we received the highest award, the 3 year

certification. As part of a focused accreditation preparation process, we developed a Quality Improvement Plan that forms the framework for on-going and continuous quality improvement. ASP places a high degree of emphasis on the excellence of service provision. Our outcomes are what enable us to speak as leaders in the field of dementia services and care.

We could not have achieved the levels of service provision that we did without a strong contingent of volunteers, staff and families. This year we supported 41,573 individuals and provided 61,675 hours of service. This is a 14.15% increase in service provision over last year. Throughout the year 48 languages and countries have been represented by 125 staff members. With the magnitude of diversity within the Peel Region, we are pleased that our organization is a true representation of the communities we serve. We strive to meet the needs of those affected by Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia. Our goal will continue to be providing access for everyone who requires assistance during their transition through this disease.

We thank you for your support and look forward to continuing our work in partnership with this community in order to reach our goal and maximize the quality of life of those affected by Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia.
